BIOGRAPHY

Iván Franco (b. 1979, Ourense, Spain) is a contemporary artist based in Barcelona whose work explores the philosophical tensions between reality, perception, and simulacrum. His practice is deeply influenced by post-structuralist thought, particularly the writings of Jean Baudrillard, interrogating the unstable relationship between images and truth. Franco's work exists within the realm of conceptual abstraction, where the visual field is not merely a representation but an active questioning of reality itself

Franco's work moves beyond traditional modes of representation, rejecting any clear distinction between the real and the simulated. His paintings function as objects in themselves—matter-images that transcend narrative to emphasize presence and meaning through form. Drawing upon strategies that mimic the mechanisms of reality, Franco challenges the way we identify and interpret truth, questioning whether it exists at all.

Central to his work is the notion that images do not simply reflect reality but, rather, construct and mediate it. His paintings and installations blur the line between sign and substance, evoking a contemplation of existence through the lens of the simulacrum. As Baudrillard suggests, Franco's works do not attempt to reveal an underlying truth but rather expose the idea that truth itself may be an illusion.

Franco's artistic inquiry is deeply tied to the discourse surrounding image-making and its relationship to perception. His works reference a long lineage of philosophical and artistic investigations into representation, from iconoclasm to contemporary media theory. Like the simulacrum, his works do not attempt to conceal or reveal anything—they simply exist as a self-sustaining presence, destabilizing the viewer's assumptions about authenticity and meaning.

Franco's work has been exhibited in galleries and institutions across Spain and internationally. His conceptual approach has placed him at the forefront of contemporary debates on the nature of image and representation, garnering critical attention within both artistic and philosophical circles.

Iván Franco's work is an invitation to reconsider the way we engage with images, reality, and perception. Through a conceptual and material investigation of simulacrum, his practice does not seek to define truth but to reveal its inherent instability. His paintings do not simply depict—they challenge, unsettle, and demand contemplation, offering a powerful meditation on the nature of existence itself.
